Will you be closing streets?

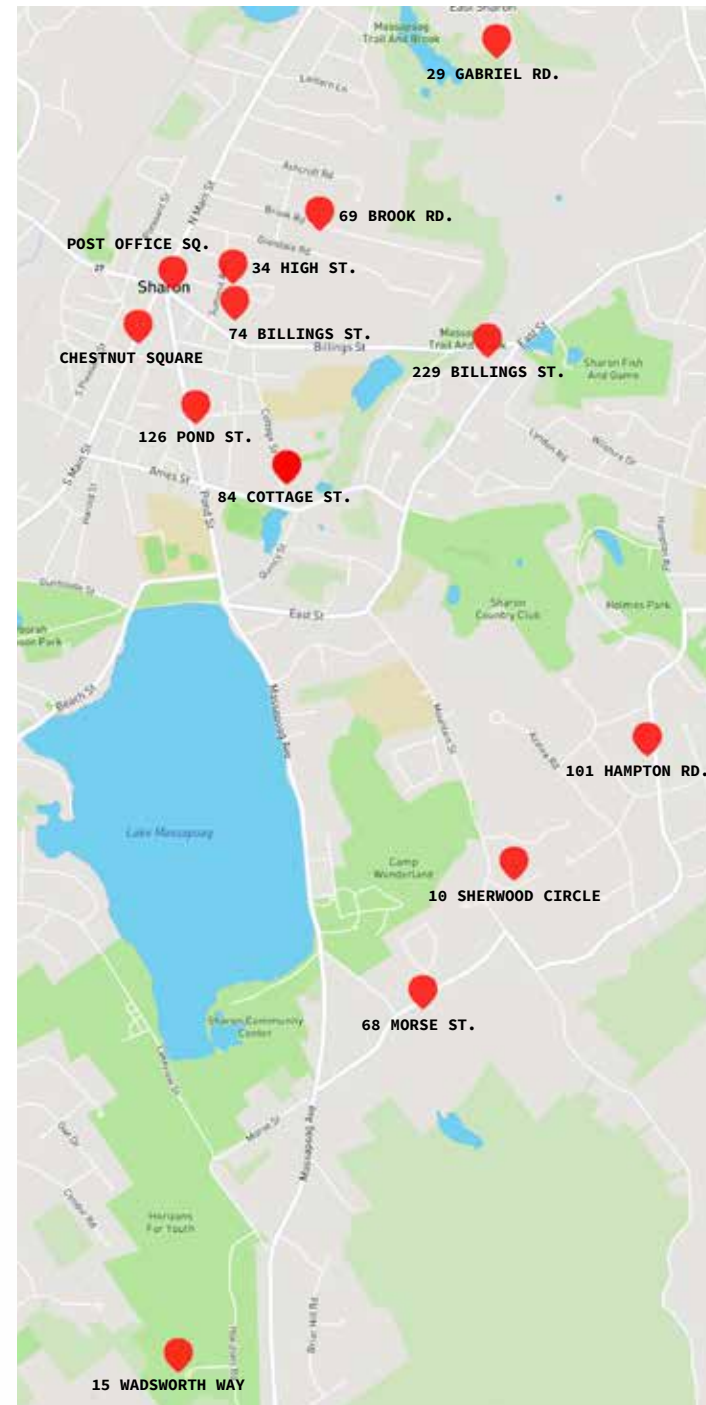
